

Charity Scott, JD, MSCM is Professor of Law with a joint appointment at Georgia State University's College of Law and J. Mack Robinson College of Business, Institute of Health Administration. She is the Director of the Center for Law, Health & Society at the College of Law. Scott is also a Faculty Fellow in Health Law with Emory University's Center for Ethics. She teaches courses on health care law and policy, bioethics, tort law, and negotiation. She has served as Chair of the Health Law Section of the State Bar of Georgia and in various leadership capacities with the ABA Health Law Section and other professional associations. Scott has given national and regional presentations on topics in health law, policy, and ethics and has published on a variety of health law issues, including antitrust, medical ethics, medical privacy, and health policy. She is the editor of a column on teaching health law for the American Journal of Law, Medicine & Ethics. She is a member of the American Law Institute, and was the 2006 recipient of the Jay Healey Distinguished Health Law Teacher Award, presented by the American Society of Law, Medicine & Ethics.
