

Jane M. Orient, MD, FACP, obtained her undergraduate degrees in chemistry and mathematics from the University of Arizona in Tucson, and her MD from Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in 1974. She completed an internal medicine residency at Parkland Memorial Hospital and University of Arizona Affiliated Hospitals and then became an instructor at the University of Arizona College of Medicine. She has been in solo private practice since 1981 and has served as executive director of the Association of American Physicians and Surgeons (AAPS) since 1989.

She is the author of *YOUR Doctor Is Not In: Healthy Skepticism about National Healthcare, Sutton's Law*, which is a novel about where the money is in medicine today, and the second and third editions of *Sapira's Art and Science of Bedside Diagnosis*. She coauthored two novels published as e-books, *Neomorts* and *Moonshine*, and books for schoolchildren, *Professor Klugimkopf's Old-Fashioned English Grammar* and *Professor Klugimkopf's Spelling Method*, published by Robinson Books. More than 100 of her papers have been published in the scientific and popular literature on a variety of subjects including risk assessment, natural and technological hazards and nonhazards, and medical economics and ethics. She is the editor of *AAPS News*, the *Doctors for Disaster Preparedness Newsletter*, and *Civil Defense Perspectives*, and is the managing editor of the *Journal of American Physicians and Surgeons*.
