

Mark Fisher, MD, JD, FCLM is professor of neurology, anatomy & neurobiology, and political science at University California, Irvine, where he served as chair of the Department of Neurology from 1998 – 2006 and established the UCI Stroke Center. He obtained his MD from University of Cincinnati and JD from Loyola Law School. He studied political science as an undergraduate (BA from UCLA) and graduate student (MA from University of South Dakota). From 1980 – 1998, he was a faculty member in the Department of Neurology at University of Southern California, where he established one of the first stroke programs on the West Coast. He currently directs a stroke research laboratory of vascular neurobiology, teaches residents in neurology, and directs a stroke prevention clinic. He is listed in Best Doctors in America and Castle Connolly's America's Top Doctors, and received the Orange County Medical Association's Physician of Excellence Award for 2007. In the UC Irvine Department of Political Science, he teaches the graduate seminar "Emotion & Politics" and the undergraduate course "Introduction to Law & Medicine."
