

Martin J. Stillman, MD, JD, FCLM, is a national educator of medicolegal issues. He delivers continued education programs for healthcare providers (CME), lawyers (CLE), and other organizations such as the American College of Healthcare Executives and American Society for Healthcare Risk Management. He focuses on topics such as medical malpractice, risk management, and pain management as well as customized, interactive in-house programs, which cover a wide variety of relevant medicolegal topics. He also provides educational and risk management consultation for physicians, attorneys, and insurance providers.

Dr. Stillman is recognized as an outstanding teacher and advisor. During his residency, he received a Minnesota Medical Foundation Distinguished Teaching Award, and he continues to develop and teach top-rated medicolegal curriculum for first and second-year medical students at the University of Minnesota Medical School. He serves on the Advisory Board for the Joint Degree Program in Law and Values in Health, Environment and the Life Sciences at the University of Minnesota, as well as the Advisory Board for the Hamline University Health Law Institute.

Dr. Stillman brings his knowledge and expertise to both local and national organizations. He currently serves as president of the Minnesota Medical Alumni Society and co-chairs the Health and Safety Committee for the Herzl Camp Board of Directors. As a board member of the American College of Legal Medicine (ACLM), he serves as chair of both the Membership and Young Leadership Committees. In 2001, Dr. Stillman developed and implemented the annual professional development luncheon conference at the ACLM annual meeting to formally enhance the development of those with training in law and medicine. In 2005, he was honored with an annual ACLM award for Outstanding Service to the College.

Dr. Stillman also writes about issues involving law and medicine, and has been published in JAMA's *A Piece of My Mind* section reflecting on the education of doctors and lawyers and the different ways they approach problem solving.

Dr. Stillman currently practices internal medicine at Hennepin County Medical Center and is assistant professor of medicine at the University of Minnesota Medical School. He graduated from the University of Minnesota Law School in 1993 and the University of Minnesota Medical School in 1997. He completed his training in internal medicine at Hennepin County Medical Center in Minneapolis, Minnesota in 2000. Upon completion of his residency, he was selected to serve as a chief resident. In 2000, Dr. Stillman became a fellow in the ACLM.

Dr. Stillman lives in Saint Louis Park, Minnesota with his wife Amy Susman-Stillman, PhD, a developmental and educational psychologist, and three children.
