

Marvin Firestone, MD, JD, FCLM, DLFAPA holds a medical degree from Temple University (1964) and a law degree from the University of Colorado (1980). He is board certified in legal medicine (1982), psychiatry (1971) with added qualification in geriatric psychiatry (1995), and forensic psychiatry (1985). He is a fellow of the American Academy of Forensic Sciences and past president and fellow of the American College of Legal Medicine; he is on the Board of Legal Medicine; he is a Distinguished Life Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association; and Distinguished Fellow of the Pacific Rim College of Psychiatrists. He was editor-in-chief of Medical Legal Lessons; editor-in-chief emeritus of Legal Medicine Questions and Answers; on the editorial board of the Journal of Legal Medicine and deputy editor of Legal Medicine and Medical Malpractice Survival Handbook, publications of the American College of Legal Medicine. He formerly held the Hirsh Chair at the George Washington University in Washington, D.C., where he was professor at its Medical and Law Schools and School of Health Services Administration, teaching Legal Medicine, Psychiatry and the Law, and Legal Aspects of Hospital Administration. Dr. Firestone has served as an examiner for the American Board of Forensic Psychiatry. He is past president of the Northern California Psychiatric Society, District Branch of the American Psychiatric Association; member of the California Psychiatric Association Council; a member of the Diversion Advisory Counsel of the California Medical Board; and a member of the Board of Directors of the San Mateo Medical Association.

A frequent lecturer at national law and medicine conferences, Dr. Firestone has authored journal articles in his fields of expertise in The Medical Malpractice Survival Handbook (Mosby); Legal Medicine (Mosby); Textbook of Forensic Psychiatry (APPI), and Head and Neck Injury Handbook (Shepard's McGraw Hill). He is the deputy editor of Legal Medicine and The Medical Malpractice Survival Handbook. His primary offices are in the San Francisco Bay area, where he serves as consultant in neuropsychiatry to the Brain Injury Rehabilitation Unit of the Palo Alto V.A. Medical Center (associated with Stanford University School of Medicine) and is lecturer in the Psychiatric Residency Training Program at Stanford and on the teaching faculty of the Psychiatric Residency Training Program at San Mateo County (Chope) Hospital.

Dr. Firestone provides medical-legal consultation and neuropsychiatric evaluations for the courts and legal community and serves as expert witness regarding neuropsychiatry and geriatric psychiatry issues. He is also a lecturer and seminar chairman for International Conferences, providing medical-legal education to the legal and medical professions.

Dr. Firestone's legal practice primarily involves representation of physicians in cases involving hospital staff privilege disputes, licensure, medical practice contractual issues, and medical malpractice. He is a certified mediator and a member of the bar in several state and federal jurisdictions, including California, Colorado, the District of Columbia, the U.S. Claims Court and the U.S. Supreme Court.
